EVENT SCHEDULE

The Grands Assault will provide the ultimate prize for competitors, with victors in each of the rounds receiving a prize, while the overall winners of the series will receive a paid for trip, including entry into the Grand Nationals in Tulsa, Oklahoma, USA that are held each year. The series replaces the Grands Challenge, which in recent years has been run over one competition day during the BMX Australia National Championships.

NOTE: The series prizes of the trip and entry into the Grand Nationals is only available for athletes eligible to represent Australia internationally





SERIES POINTS SCHEDULE

Riders receive one bonus point for each rider in their Series Class	

① Series ranking points for 1st to 8th in the Class correspond with the overall place in the entered class.

The Semi and Quarter Final points are based on actual race placings.

2 Round 5 awarded double points.

Points from a rider's best four (4) rounds count towards the series total.

In the case of a tie at the end of the series, the tie will be resolved as follows:

- A. First in favour of the rider who earned the most first place finishes in the series
- B. Then, if a tie still remains, in favour of the rider who earned the most second place finishes in the series and so on.





GRANDS ASSAULT SERIES PERIMETERS

- The 2017 BMXA Grands Assault Series is for the following 20" Classes:
 - 10,11,12,13,14, 15 and 16 Boys and girls
 - A Pro Men, AA Pro Men, Pro Women, Vet Pro③. Age determination being 2017 (year of competition rule) minus Year of Birth.
 - ③ Vet Pro has a minimum age requirement of 33 to align with USA BMX regulations for the Vet Pro class at the USA Grands.
- Riders may only enter one class at each round of the Series.
- Should a rider change class during the series, they must enter all subsequent rounds in the new class and will forfeit all Series Points from the first entered class.
- A condition of entry is that riders use the Official Series number plate. This plate will be issued free to all riders at the first round of the series that they enter and must be used for all subsequent rounds.
 - Replacement of a "left at home" plate will be at a cost of \$20 to the rider.
 - Riders who are also competing in the National Series will are to use the same plate for both series.
- The Series is sanctioned as a NS level event by BMXA run under the BMX Australia Rule Book.
- Transfers and scoring per BMXA Rule Book section 013.
 - A minimum of 5 riders constitutes a class.
 - Three scrambled motos, qualifiers and final.
 - Olympic lane draws for qualifiers and finals gate positions per rule 019
 - Deadman finals for classes with more than one gate per rule 013.1.a
 - Deadman final for classes with 1 full gate or less per rule 013.2.b
- Transponder scoring used for all rounds of the series.
 - As per BMXA Rule 015.2, the rider is solely responsible for the correct attachment of the transponder during the race.
 - Any rider who starts in a heat without a transponder attached to the bike will be scored as Did Not Finish (DNF) per UCI rule 6.1.039.b.
 - Riders hiring a transponder must return it to the race organizer at the conclusion of the event. Failure to
 do so will incur a cost to the rider of \$150 plus costs.

Series Points will be allocated for each round per the schedule in this document.





PRIZE MONEY

The Prize Pool for each round is paid for podium finishes only with the breakdown per BMXA rules for 10-16 Boys & Girls and Vet Pro receiving, 1st Place – 50%, 2nd Place – 30% and 3rd Place – 20%

At the end of 2017 Grands Assault Series – the highest scorer will receive a Return Flight to the Grands in the US. The prize consists of 1 x economy return airfare, 5 x nights accommodation, Entry into Grands and US Nationals. Please note the Grand Prizes are only available for Australian Members.

International riders are free to race in the Grands Assault Series however will only qualify for Prize Pool and not the Grands Prize.

For all rounds of the 2017 Grands Assault Series, prize money will be paid to all domestic Australian winners via EFT. It is a rider's responsibility to download the payment form available on the BMXA website and to complete and return to BMXA. If no form is returned, payment of prize money will be delayed.
